"I secretly listen to the messages every night"

3.57 billion people have never heard the gospel. Millions have no access to Bible teaching in their own language. And more than 380 million Christians worldwide face persecution and discrimination for their faith. People like Ab*.

One evening, a programme broadcast by **Radio T*** caught Ab's attention. For the first time, he heard words from the Bible in his own language, spoken in a way he could understand. The presenter shared the story of Joseph — betrayed, enslaved, yet raised up by God to save a nation. The themes of forgiveness touched something within

him and he was moved deeply to the point that he visited the radio station.

There, the *Radio T* team gifted him a small radio and a memory card filled with Biblical programmes and Christian songs. However, exploring the Christian faith also meant Ab had to face challenges close to home.

"I know that my family would not understand my interest in these biblical stories," Ab shared, "so I secretly listen to the messages every night."

"My name is Ab. I live in Timbuktu, with my wife and our four children. I've always been passionate about radio. However, I never thought that the radio would totally change my life."

Introduction

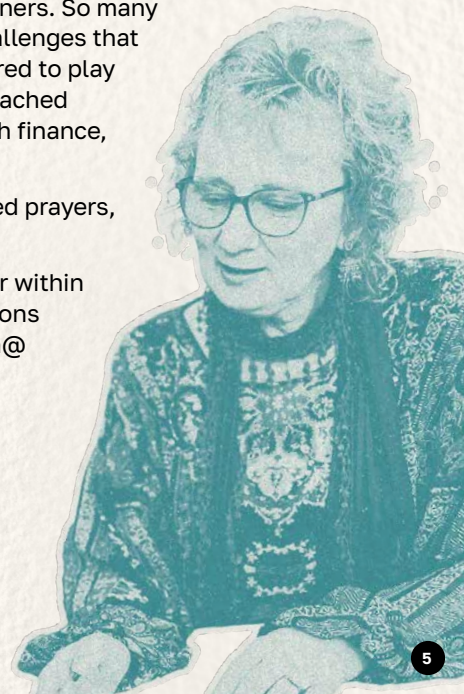

Feba UK

To the mountains of Kyrgyzstan and the streets of Baghdad, supporters of Feba UK brought hope to people living in some of the hardest-to-reach places in the world. Through radio, audio, digital media and personal relationships, God’s word was delivered to new places and new audiences.

We share their stories to remind us why Feba UK exists – to stand alongside partners and enable them to communicate the hope of Jesus where it is most urgently needed.

Supporting our partners

Your commitment to Feba UK allowed us to encourage and support our partners in Africa, Asia and the Middle East.

International Visits: Our International Ministry team travelled to Central Asia, Pakistan, Bangladesh and India to meet partners and listeners, to gain a deeper understanding of their contexts, to see first-hand the impact of their ministries, and to the Middle East to offer training alongside sister organizations at conferences and gatherings.

Training and Collaboration: Our team held webinars to resource and support our partners’ work and training in improved data collection to measure their impact.

New Staff: We recruited new staff to enhance our International Ministry team, with a new Head of International Ministry and an International Ministry Project Manager, enabling us to serve our partners more effectively.

Partner Conference: The new team was responsible for planning our first-ever in-person partner conference in October 2025, bringing together the Feba UK team and our international partners as a family of believers – sharing experiences, learning new skills, praying and resting together, and recapturing God’s vision for our shared mission.

With your support, our partners witnessed joyful firsts and breakthroughs in their ministries throughout 2025. There were many reports of listeners’ lives being transformed through the communication of God’s word in different places, to different audiences, via different platforms and media.

TRANSFORM

Increased content output across all our ministry partners

- **FM radio** programmes transmitted by our partners leapt up 29% to a total of 864.25 hours a week.
- Content shared across **social media platforms** jumped a staggering 73% to 1422.75 hours a week.
- Distribution of **SD cards** rose 82% and **speaker boxes** rocketed 10,360% (not a typo!).

Double time in Ethiopia

Ethiopia Media Project was a stunning example of a growing ministry. Radio output doubled its airtime, sharing a total of 209 radio broadcasts across the year, and gained 1,180 followers within just three months of launching their TikTok account. This shows what a powerful tool it can be for reaching spiritually-open young people and complements the project’s two Telegram (a popular messaging app) channels for Amharic and Gurage speakers.

New stations & partners

Iraq FM established a new station in Basra, with plans for 2 more stations in 2026. Their Facebook page also enabled people to contact the team privately to request Bibles – an essential safeguard in a highly sensitive context, allowing more people access to God's word.

Feba increased the number of projects and countries where your support is reaching people, with new partnerships in **Cambodia** and **Vietnam**. We were delighted to welcome these new partners as they grow and develop their audio bible programmes.

FAITH

Going solar

We were able to support our partner in **Nepal** to distribute solar-powered radios to listeners, some of whom previously spent hundreds of rupees on batteries to listen to radio, allowing them to tune in without interruption or cost.



Resourcing our supporters

As the foundation of everything we do, we sought ways to inform, inspire and engage our supporters:

Building Connection: Our printed resources, website, emails, social media and online prayer meetings helped our supporters to learn about and pray into what God is doing in other parts of the world. In this way, we continue to build relationships and community with you that bless us and our work.

Big Church Festival: We were thrilled to introduce new people to our ministry and meet up with old friends for fellowship and fun. Particularly inspiring was the number of Gen Z engaging with us at our event stand and learning about the impact we are having.

The Church Sound & Media Summit (TCSMS): Feba UK partnered with this event for the first time to link the work of audio media teams in the UK with the work our partners do in different contexts and for different audiences. Our ministry partner from India attended and shared his experience, enthusing others to engage in gospel broadcasting.

Church visits: We loved catching up with many of our supporting churches, and visiting new ones, building connection, igniting passion for mission and sharing updates on our work. Each church member was invited to write a message of hope which are shared with our partners and listeners.

INSPIRE



Be patient in tribulation

Many of our partners live and work in places where sharing the gospel puts them and their loved ones at considerable risk. Reaching people in hard-to-reach areas often means encountering poor infrastructure, environmental dangers and hostility.

As ever, in 2025, there was a need to pray for patience and determination as our partners sought to share God's word where it's not known, banned or not easy to access.



Infrastructure and environment

Power failures created difficulties for many of our partners including **Egypt, Kyrgyzstan** and **Iraq**, disrupting broadcasts and damaging equipment. At times, staff had to relocate or use internet cafés to stay on air.

Poor road conditions were a major challenge for our partners in **Cambodia**, who needed to reach remote communities, slowing the pace of their ministry activities. In **India**, the *Youth Project* team travelled on dangerous, unmade roads to meet with listeners and volunteers.

Our partners in **Nepal** had to tackle a long-standing vulnerability by improving lightning protection at their station—a vital step given the annual risk of storm damage.

Persecution

Our partners in the **Central Asia Project** were constantly under surveillance, risking arrest or fines for ministering in places where proselytism is illegal.

Churches among the *Sparrow** people in **Northeast Africa** faced repeated attacks. Some were burnt down and destroyed, with many believers displaced from their homes and places of worship.

The team at **Iraq FM** received threats from Zahid*, a Muslim listener. Despite the danger, the team met him and gave him a Bible. There was much rejoicing when that same listener recently shared:

"I am a new person thanks to the radio, and you have changed many things in me. I approached you with evil, but you offered me love, and this truly affected me, bringing me closer to you and to Christ as well."

Conflict and instability

In **Mali**, where many regions are under strict Islamic law, *Radio T* kept sharing the love of Jesus despite expanding Jihadist violence. In Northeast Africa, regional conflicts and armed groups known for kidnapping for ransom made travel dangerous.

Conflict in **Ukraine** affects the everyday work of the FEBC Ukraine team, supporting soldiers and their families through fear, stress, trauma, and grief, including members of the team who are serving on the front line.

In **Yemen**, our partners ministered to millions of people living in constant fear from missile strikes, aerial bombardment, food insecurity, limited clean water, and the collapse of essential services. A believer told a member of the Yemen Project team how the war has damaged not just buildings, but also people's inner selves, making life feel desperate. Despite this, the team said *"what she hears from us gives her hope and new life."*

In Iraq, power fluctuations led to cooling system failures and transmitter outages, requiring quick fixes and backup activation, and in Ethiopia, suffered from d

PEACE

Answered prayers

When we pray, God changes things. Here are some of the answered prayers we saw this year

Praise God that His word is now available in all four major dialects spoken by the Central Asian tribal group.

We give thanks for the ways God is answering prayers in listeners' lives. While we may never hear all the details, our partners report that people are experiencing 'miracles' in their everyday lives through their prayers in Jesus' name.

As an organisation, Feba UK and our partners are rooted in prayer. It underpins everything we do. Trustees and staff pray together for our work and our impact, and our Feba UK staff team prays daily for supporters, our staff, our partners, our work and the wider world. We regularly study the Bible together, pausing to surrender all that we do to Him.

Monthly online prayer meetings allow us to pray as a wider group when a partner joins the Feba UK team and supporters to share stories and prayer requests. **‘Prayer Focus’**, our monthly prayer resource, enables the UK Church to pray into the needs of partners and listeners, and to give thanks and praise to God for answered prayers.

Our partners around the world place the same importance on prayer. Like us, they believe it's the key for their ministry operations. Dawit*, our **Northeast Africa** Coordinator knows it's essential to lift his work to God: *“In our office we spend time with God daily. We pray about our audience, our family, our work, and pray for His guidance, wisdom and understanding.”*

Whenever we hear of someone turning to Jesus, wherever they are in the world, prayer is always present. **Radio 7* in Mali** saw a powerful answer to prayer when one of their presenters invited listeners to pray. Following a canoeing accident, Malick* had spent months unable to move or do anything, despite the efforts of his family marabout (a Muslim holy man) and traditional medicines.

“One evening, while listening to the radio, I came across a Christian programme that talked about the healing power of Jesus. After repeating the presenter's prayer for healing I felt my body quiver, I was sweating profusely. When I woke up, I was totally healed. Jesus brought new meaning to my life and the strength to continue.”

Incredible stories continue to come out of the Counseling and Prayer Department run by **Radio Wimbe in Mozambique**. It helped 422 people last year, including Maida, a Muslim who found freedom in Jesus after requesting prayer when she needed spiritual help.

As our partner at **Gaweylon**, broadcasting into Tibet explains – *“Our most important support is people praying for us.”*

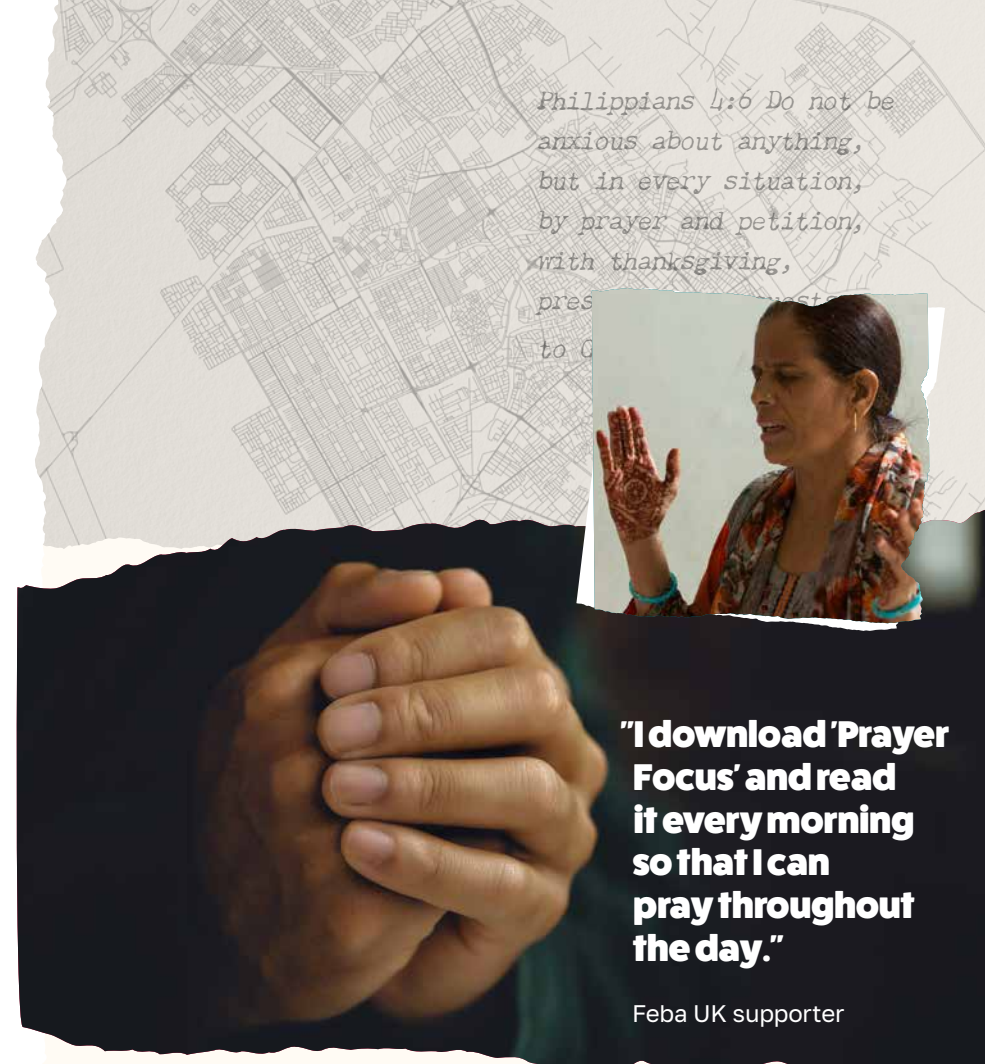

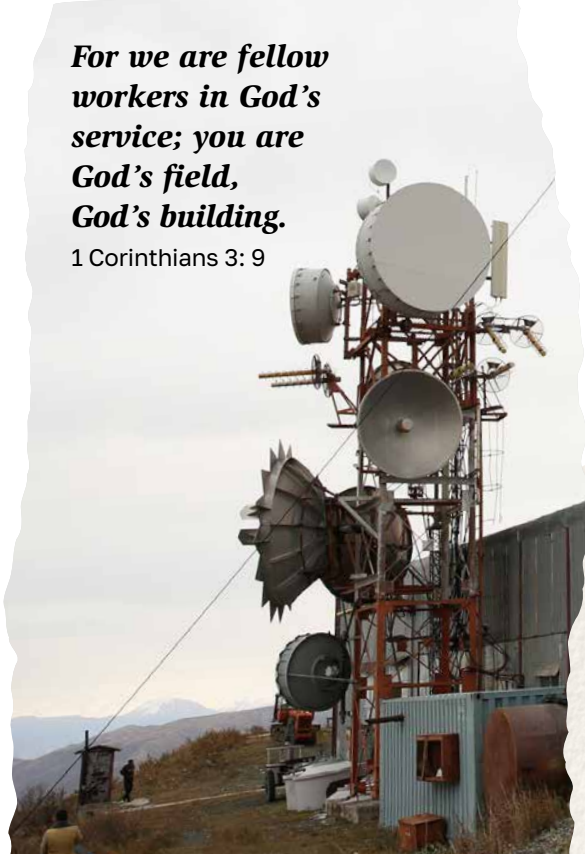
In the financial year from October 2024 to September 2025, we received a total of £2.4 million in income against an expenditure of £1.8 million. A major factor in this income was a **significant and unexpected legacy of one million pounds**.

The team were humbled and blessed by this gift, and it is a reminder of the incredible generosity of all our supporters who give so sacrificially.

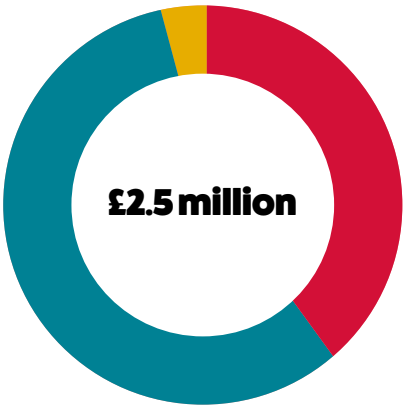
The majority of our expenditure went directly to our partners, allowing them to carry out the work on the good; recording, producing and broadcasting the good news. These grants also meant that those who have never heard God's message of hope had the opportunity to not only hear but go deeper, speaking with follow-up teams, joining disciple groups and discovering more about Jesus.

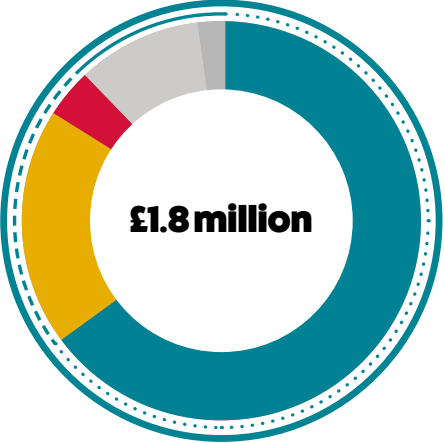
For every £1 that we receive to fulfil our purpose, we spend approximately:

65p on partner support to ensure that our partners are equipped, accountable, empowered, and encouraged to be effective in their media ministry

23p on mobilising the UK Church, so that Kingdom-hearted people are gathered, informed, inspired, and engaged to support and advance the work

12p on ensuring that Feba is sustainable, legally compliant and demonstrates best practices

Tarik's story: Ethiopia

Reached by God through the power of radio

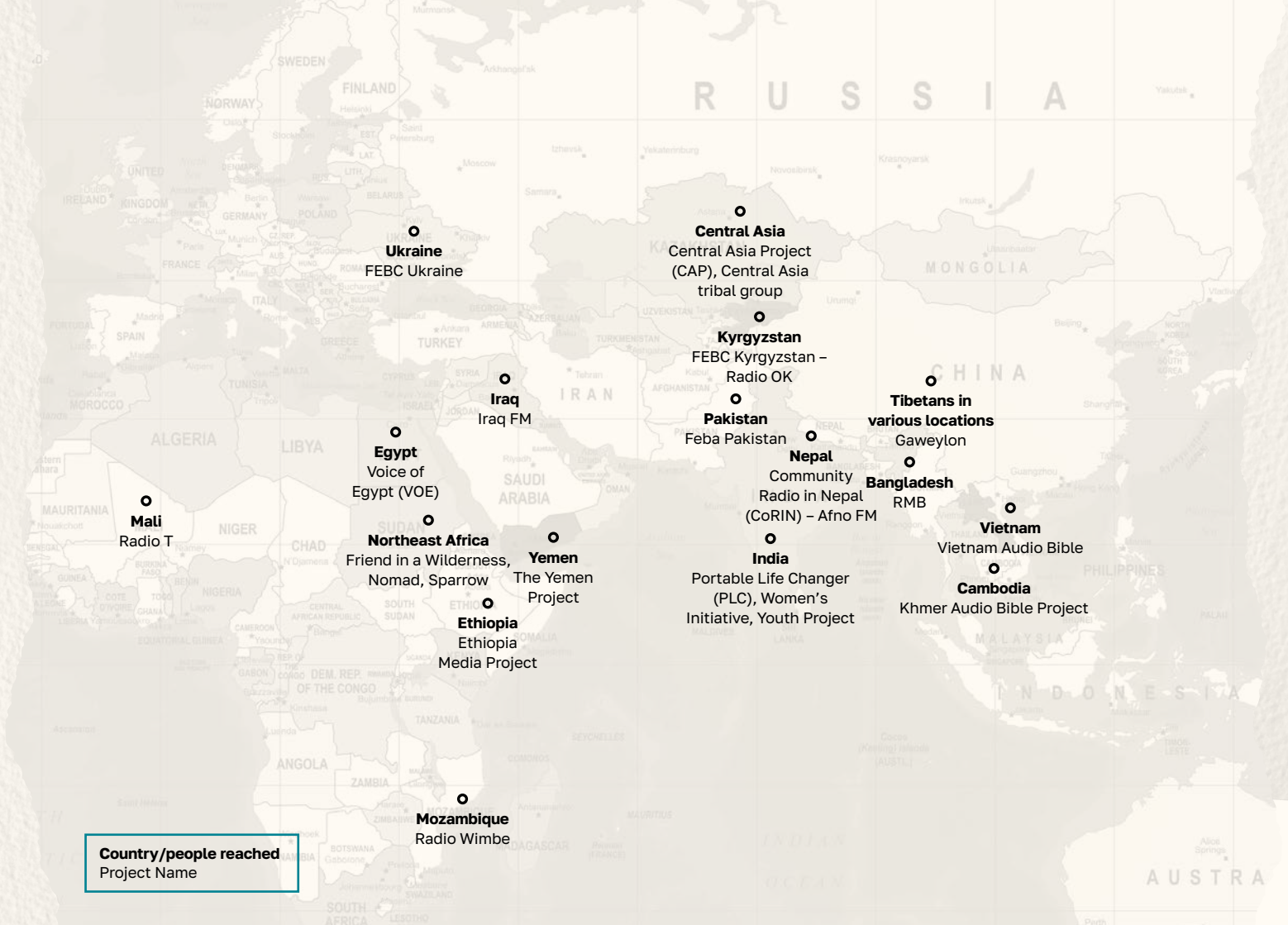
Tarik* was once a feared and powerful thief living in Ethiopia's capital. He led a gang that stole from others as if it were a game – drinking and looting. But when his crimes caught up with him, he fled to a remote village.

While in hiding, Tarik stumbled across one of the **Ethiopia Media Project's** broadcasts talking about how Jesus is the Good Shepherd. The message spoke directly to his heart. That night, he couldn't sleep.

Returning to the city, he slipped back into his life of crime until he unexpectedly ran into one of his former gang members. He learnt that his friend had been in prison, where he had accepted Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour. Tarik was stunned. Remembering what he had heard on the radio, and seeing his friend's transformation, Tarik decided to surrender his life to Christ!

He returned to his hometown, bought a radio and began to listen regularly. Slowly, steadily, God rebuilt his life.

Today, Tarik's life is unrecognisable – he is married, restored and walking in hope – reached by God through the power of radio.



Madhur's story: Nepal

Comfort, belonging and peace

In Nepal, 76 year old Madur* remembers the day **Afno FM** went on air in 2008 – and he's been listening ever since. Hearing programmes in his own heart language has given him comfort, a sense of belonging and peace and says *"The radio is my life's companion."*

After years of ill health, Madur put his faith in Jesus and experienced remarkable healing. **Afno FM's** devotionals have strengthened his walk with Christ.

To support his family – and buy batteries for his radio – Madur spent long hours making ropes from plastic sacks to sell. When the **Afno FM** team heard this, they gave him a solar radio so he can now listen for free!

Transformed by the Word of God, Madur is eager to share Jesus' love with others. The radio in his small shop is tuned to **Afno FM** so that everyone who passes by can hear God's message of hope.
